Apart from rain, two teams playing a skilful, close, committed and competitive game without a bad tackle or hint of dissent. I heard lots of encouragement from coaches and a lot of support from families. I also heard people talk of a competitive season with lots of close games played in a good spirit, with a sense that opposing coaches were in this together, supporting each other. There were also two church members who had braved the foul weather to take drinks over to the pitch side.

Let's be clear: we are not perfect, and we do have issues to resolve from time to time, and many wonderful, committed people are involved in other leagues.

That should not stop us, however, being thankful for what we perceive that God is doing among us, for each game that brings people together to compete in healthy sport and acknowledge that this was God's idea in the first place, we are thankful.

I would like to finish on a personal note of thankfulness. I recently played 90 minutes for Gateway Vineyard in the adult league due to unexpected player shortage. I am thankful for the reminder of what it is like to be in the middle of a committed, passionate, skilful, friendly game of football. We had a calm, friendly ref, a player on each side who needed their colleagues to 'manage' them (they did), a church leader playing, and at the end, smiles all round.
